- **School administrators and system leaders** who wish to support transformative inquiry-based learning for engaged citizenship.

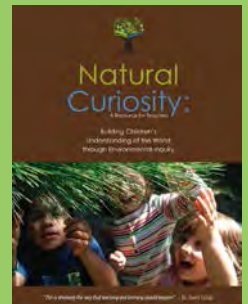
## Outcomes—through their participation, educators will:
