
Highlights from LSF's national survey: Canadians' Perspectives on Climate Change & Education

agree the pandemic has helped them to recognize the importance of science to provide society with essential facts & evidencebased knowledge




4% realize that no matter where we are in the world, we are all interconnected


470 Canadians
